SUBJECT: FY24 Pastoral Skills Intensive Course (PSIC)

1. Reference. AR 165-1, Army Chaplain Corps Activities, 23 June 2015
2. Purpose. The intent of PSIC is to equip chaplains with counseling skills to better assist the Army Community in developing healthy relationships and the ability to thrive under the pressures of military life. PSIC will train Chaplains in several evidence-based, faith-informed counseling practices and interventions. PSIC meets the AR 165-1 requirement for 100 hours of Pastoral Skills Training – Family Life (PST-FL) for Chaplain Professional Reinforcement Training (CPRT). PSIC also builds a broad base of interest for prospective Family Life Chaplains (FLCs).
3. Training. Topics include basic counseling skills refresher, theological integration, family systems theory and practice, trauma-informed counseling, solution focused brief therapy, marital infidelity recovery counseling, assessment and intervention, grief and loss, self-care and ethical issues in counseling. Training will include live observation of counseling sessions and active role-play skill development.
4. Enrollment. Chaplains from all components (AD, ARNG, and USAR) are considered for attendance.
  - a. Compo 2 & 3 Chaplains have priority for enrollment in the course. PSIC is not available to Chaplain Candidates.
  - b. AD/Compo 1 Chaplains should first coordinate with their installation Family Life Chaplain to complete PST-FL (equivalent to PSIC) before applying to PSIC. AD CHs who have completed PST-FL and want to attend PSIC will be put on a wait list and enrolled if space is available.
5. Execution.
  - a. The Chaplain Family Life Center (CFLC) at JBLM, WA and the Chaplain Family Life Training Center (CFLTTC) at Fort Cavazos, TX will provide the didactic instruction and clinical training for PSIC.
  - b. Training location and dates (dates include two travel days):  
JBLM, WA 10 - 23 Mar 24  
Fort Cavazos, TX 19 May – 1 June 24

c. Funding. All travel, lodging and per diem are funded by chaplain's unit.

d. Complete the attached application form and submit to [john.p.manuel.mil@army.mil](mailto:john.p.manuel.mil@army.mil). Compo 2 & 3 should submit application to their Compo HQ (see POCs below) to ensure all mandatory PME is completed before enrollment. Before submitting application, ensure all signatures are obtained on the attached application form. Failure to do so will result in the application not being processed.

e. AD chaplains will automatically be enrolled in ATRRS through the IRL Graduate School Registrar after application approval. Compo 2 applicants will coordinate ATRRS enrollment with their unit. Compo 3 managers will enroll chaplains in ATRRS. All Chaplains will receive an automated ATRRS email stating they are on the "wait list" for the course. Chaplains should disregard this language since they will actually be enrolled. The CFLTC will send a welcome letter with additional instructions approximately 30 days prior to course start date.

f. PSIC graduates will receive a DA Form 87 Certificate of Training.
