

## Chaplain (MAJ) Kevin W. Trimble Director, School for Professional Development

CH (MAJ) Kevin Trimble is the Director for the School for Professional Development at Fort Jackson, SC. Chaplain Trimble was commissioned and assigned as an active-duty Army Chaplain in 2008. Prior to entering the Chaplain Corps, he served for over twenty years as a Senior Pastor.

His academic education includes a Doctor of Theology, a Master of Theology, both from Andersonville Baptist Seminary and a master's in religious ministries from Randall University in Moore, Oklahoma.

His military education includes the Chaplain Officer Basic and Advanced Courses; Airborne School; Air Assault School; Pathfinder School; Joint Special Operations University Chaplain Course and Command and Staff General Staff College.

Previous assignments include Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas; Battalion Chaplain, 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion 1<sup>st</sup> Special Warfare Center and School (Airborne), Fort Bragg, NC; Battalion Chaplain, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Combat Aviation Brigade, Fort Riley, KS; Battalion Chaplain, 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion, 101<sup>st</sup> Combat Aviation Bridge, (Air Assault) Fort Campbell, KY. In addition, he has deployed on two combat tours to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.
